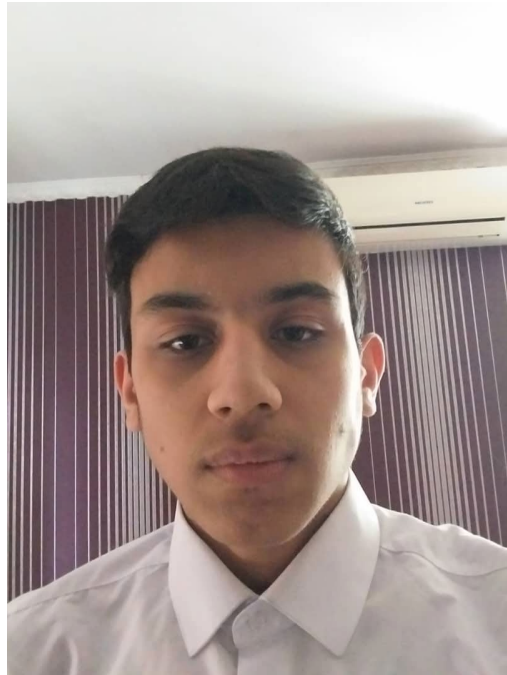


## ARMUGHON AND SHODMEHR, TAJIKISTAN
